Dear Members and Friends of Trinity UMC,

As I thought about what exactly to say in my last Chimes article to you, I have had a stream of memories racing through my mind. In January of 2015 I was scheduled to meet with Rev. David Harris about moving to Trinity as the associate pastor. A few days before we were supposed to meet my dad took a turn and instead we stood together at Kobacker House in Columbus, Ohio laughing, crying and praying with dad before he passed. The next week consisted of a funeral, my son's birthday and my introduction to Trinity's SPRC. It is hard to believe that it has been more than 8 years since that week. There have been many more weeks with similar highs and lows. Weddings and funerals, spaghetti dinners and weekly breakfasts, renovations and repairs, baptisms and hospital visits, mission trips and worship... I could go on and on.

And from the day I first moved here in 1978, much has changed. When we moved back to Lima in 1993, I had changed and so had this congregation. When we arrived in Lima in 2015, my son was a Peter Pan hat wearing 5th grader and now he is graduating high school. We've been through a pandemic of which we are still feeling the effects. Change is a part of faith and we will be talking about what it means to be formed and reformed in faith over the next month in worship. But for today, I thought I'd look back a little and re-share a few of the ways that the people of Lima Trinity shaped my early faith... I mentioned these things in my first sermon here, and I think that they can both remind us of the consistent foundation that the Church can offer as well as challenge us to reshape how we can continue to build on this foundation.

First, this is the place where I first learned that I am a beloved child of God. I learned that Jesus loves me. Through Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and just the way that various members of the congregation cared for and loved me, I have been blessed with an understanding of God's love that has never wavered. Not to say I haven't had questions for God along the way, but I have never doubted God's love for me.

Secondly, I learned that God loves everyone. God's love is not reserved for me or even for people who look and act like me. That all people are God's children and therefore beloved. And although I have not always succeeded in loving others as Jesus loves me, it is a key value that I strive to live up to.

Next, the people of Lima Trinity United Methodist Church taught me that it is not just Ok, but that it is important to ask questions, to keep learning, to continually grow in my faith and discipleship. It was in youth group here where I was given the freedom to express doubts and differences of opinions and at the end of the day we always knew that we were still a part of the same faith family deeply loved by God and each other.

And finally all of this is still true even when we mess up. The power of Jesus' life, death and resurrection is most profound through grace. Nothing we can do or say separates us from the love of God. In seminary I learned a lot about the theological term of grace that helped me to grow in my faith, but here, I discovered, in practice, what it meant to be forgiven and loved when I messed up.

And while ministry today looks very different than ministry in 1995, I have watched my son learn these same values. I want to thank you for being his village as he grew up the same way that you were my village as I grew up many years before. As Patty Reed said this past Sunday, I have spent 17 years of my life (and an additional 7 where my parents still lived here) in Lima and at Trinity United Methodist Church. I know that many of you have been here longer, but as an itinerant pastor and a preacher's kid, it is rare to be able to say that you have been connected to the same church for half of your life. I am grateful that Lima Trinity UMC has been my home for so much of my life because I am grateful for each of you.
