Lima Area Freedom Schools Creates Safe Space for Students

In recent years, opiate abuse and deaths have risen across Ohio. Lima, Ohio, is no different. This crisis has shattered families, including leaving some children without parents.

Awareness of that reality informs the Lima Area Freedom Schools, with which Trinity Lima United Methodist Church is affiliated. Several of the 40 students have lost one or both parents to overdose.

Freedom Schools are multicultural, empowering spaces that emphasize social action, servant leadership, and self-esteem building. Understanding the reality of some students, program director Bliss Hairston prepares her Student Leader Interns (SLIs) in advance. "I tell the SLIs to show up as their authentic selves and to have patience to know kids are growing up in a different climate," Hairston said.

As leaders teach the core Freedom School curriculum, they prioritize creating a safe space for students to express pain or anger and to share if they are having a difficult day. Hairston, who has led this program for many years, remains because she believes in its mission and how it can enrich lives.

"By the end of the program, students feel safe enough to let you know if they need to take a time out or just talk to an adult," Hairston said. She also reinforces that students deserve to learn where they have come from and to know their future is limitless.

Lima Area Freedom Schools ended on Saturday, Aug. 1, with a community celebration at the Bradfield Community Center.

Highlights from Trinity's August Servant Leadership Board Meetings

FINANCE REPORT

- 1. Budget Report shows that overall things are good and there are no glaring issues.
- 2. The SLB approved a "Credit Card Use and Monthly Reconciliation Policy" along with an "Acknowledgement Form" to be signed by all staff members with Trinity credit cards with the caveat that an appeals process be created for lost receipts as well as a process for adjusting spending limits for exceptional circumstances.
- 3. The SLB assigned the Finance Team with the task of clarifying the relationship and financial obligations between Trinity and the CCCC since they share a 501(c)(3) tax number, and noted that there should also be a re-establishment of regular meetings of the CCCC Board with 50% Trinity membership and that there should be regular CCCC reports to the SLB.

TRUSTEES REPORT

- 1. The Trustees shared that the following projects have been completed are in progress:
- A. Water damage inside the parsonage was repaired and a bid from Schoolcraft Holmes Construction for \$2610 was accepted to repair the issues on the outside of the parsonage that caused the original damage inside.
- B. An inspection by the city water department of the water lines to Trinity's building was completed and okayed.
- C. The city fire department plans to conduct a training session at Trinity to familiarize the firemen with the building.
- D. Work has been completed to repair a drainage issue in the sink in the third-floor girls' restroom.
- E. Some finishing work on the island in the basement kitchen is coming off and needs repaired, and while there is a warranty covering the kitchen's initial renovation, it is a graduated warranty so Trinity and the responsible company are in negotiations as to which percentages each entity will cover.
- 2. SLB approved a motion to accept the bid from Winegardner Roofing for \$9,243.00 to repair the decking on the church building's south side roof over the multi-purpose room.

MINISTRY UPDATES

- 1. Missions: Personal care emergency kits were collected.
- 2. Worship: A shared worship experience with Shawnee UMC is being planned for "Worship in the World" on October 5.
- 3. Discipleship: The youth had a very successful summer mission trip.

OTHER BUSINESS

- 1. SLB approved the selection of the following people as members of the upcoming Capital Campaign Committee: Kevin Reeks, Paul Myers, Larry Webb, Mary Elmquist-Lane, Randy Bartels and Stephanie Roop. The chairperson is yet to be determined.
- 2. SLB also approved the selection of the following people as members of the reorganized sanctuary update group: Jeff Reed, chair; Jeff Wright, Lisa Hagerman, Bill Boutin, Ralph Hubbel, Dennis Hefner.



In other words.... Toby James (our first grandchild) is now almost two months old. After his somewhat challenged start in the world, he is doing well and up over 12 pounds. Having been a parent, I now understand the real joy of being a grandparent. But there is another side to that, as I watch my son and

daughter-in-law struggle at the job of being new parents. A certain comic actor used to observe that there was no manual for being a good parent. And the best life lesson at learning how to be a good parent was not the thing you paid attention to as you yourself were growing up.

In the same way, there is not much out there in training on how to be the Church these days. The landscape has changed dramatically over the past several years. The general decline that the church has seen over decades has swiftly overtaken us in the midst of COVID. The ups and downs of denominational drama has culminated in the recent disaffiliation of our neighbor in this region. We are ready to move on, but at the same time we are not sure in which direction to go. Even if we had the road map, would we have the energy to make the journey?

I have often said, if I had the answer, I could write the book (and be rich!).

I think I do have the answer . . . No, unfortunately, no book (and I am not going to get rich).

We must change the way we look at the problem. The real problem is our reference point. We are too focused on what has been, mourning a bygone day that is not going to return. Scripture has never suggested that we should be so focused on the events of this world, but rather be focused on what God has done within this world. Our faith is not based on the number of people that surround us on a Sunday morning worship (or at least I pray not!). Our faith is based on the salvation made possible through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

So, what if we got back to making that be what church is about and not about how many people happen to be in worship? What if we got back into the business of focusing on the message and the ministry and not about the numbers. We tend to think that we have to create the next great program to bring in 50 new people to the building so that maybe we can entice them to come back. I think we need to get back to authentic faith and worship of God and let God convict the hearts of people by our faith.

After all, that is how the Book of Acts tells us how the church was born in the first place.
