In other words....

Jami and I recently took a long weekend to Hocking Hills for a quick getaway. It was not our first choice, but Jami was able to add in a speaking stop for All In Community, which gave us some extra money to add to our fun time together.

Our cabin was in the small town of Somerset, Ohio; birthplace of Civil War General Phillip Sheridan. We took a wrong turn at the four-way stop at the town square, which took us by the Methodist Church in town. They had taken white packing tape to their front sign to cover just the flame of the United Methodist cross and flame as well as "United." So, it was the Somerset ====== Methodist Church (Oh my!). We knew at that moment that we could feel uncomfortable the entire weekend.

When we arrived at the cabin, we were greeted by our host, Dan. Dan was really friendly; made more so when he heard that I was a Methodist pastor. It turns out that Dan was Pentecostal (always fun until they pull out the snakes!), but his wife was Methodist ("Why are there so many Methodist churches?" he asks... Yeah, we didn't go far down that line of questions!). But what Dan really wanted to talk to me about was how he had found Christmas trees in the Bible (Jeremiah 10:3-4). I looked it up. Yes, I get how he thought it pointed to the idea of Christmas trees; but (in context of the customs of the time) it is talking about a pagan ritual of cutting down a tree (usually a palm tree) and erecting the bared trunk in a similar fashion as a May pole, which was a custom of Baal worship. "Nah, a Christmas tree!" said Dan. Then he wanted to delve into whether Moses had been in the Promised Land. To which the standard answer is no. Then Dan wanted to suggest the story of the Transfiguration (Where Jesus communicates with Moses and Elijah (Matthew 17, Mark 9 and Luke 9)). So, then the answer might turn to yes. BUT, Dan points out, Moses hovered over the ground so would the answer be back to no? Well, that all gets into how you want to interpret that story. Was Moses on the ground, hovering above it, communicating in a bodily form or a spiritual form. All subject to how you choose to interpret the text, and not explicitly stated in any real knowable way at all.

Thus, ended the deep Biblical study with Dan, the Pentecostal.

The moral of the story: it is our responsibility to know the Bible for ourselves; to have read the stories and to know our truth from them. To be open to the fact that our truth does not have to align 100% with someone else's understanding of truth to get along. But, that there are some truths that matter more than others (and what those are and how we make those distinctions). We need to be connected to a community of believers, to be in Sunday school, a Bible study, a small group to hone our understanding of Scripture against the understanding of others. And, to always seek to be better tomorrow than we were today.
