In other words....

Amongst the few items I brought home with me from Cuba, was 49,420 CP, or Cuban Pesos. While we entered the country being told that our American dollars would be no good, we did find that we could use them in a few places. But the money that would be most accepted was Cuban Pesos. I brought home that much because it took us so long to exchange money, I wanted to ensure that I would have a good amount to have for a return trip.

Now what you need to know (because I know you are wondering) is the context of what 49,420 Cuban Pesos is worth. The official exchange rate is 250 / 1 CP / US dollars. We did get a little better in our unofficial exchange process, but not excessively. So, if you have not done the math already, my 49,420 Cuban Pesos are worth roughly \$197.68. But, more context is needed to truly understand what that means.

In Cuba, at a nice restaurant in the resort town of Varadero, that amount I could pay for myself and 19 other people to have the steak and lobster dinner. Now mind you, that is just the dinner, you would still have to buy your own drink and/or appetizer. Here in Lima at Red Lobster (the only restaurant in town that has steak and lobster any night of the week), the same meal will cost \$900 for everyone. Context is everything. The context of Cuba does not correlate with the context of Lima, Ohio. And, these are the things that we are still learning, reflecting upon, and evaluating in what we have learned.

Lastly, the thing you have to understand is the thing you cannot buy for any price in Cuba is a Big Mac. You cannot buy, for any price, a Pepsi Cola. You can buy a knock off, Cuban brand of Coke, but if you want that distinctive taste that is Pepsi, you cannot buy it. You can buy a Big Mac in Moscow, Russia. You can buy a Big Mac in Beijing, China. You can buy a Big Mac in Tehran, Iran. But, you cannot buy a Big Mac anywhere in Cuba.

And so, we are making relationships in Cuba to change their understanding of who we are as Americans and also how we, as Americans, see Cubans. Hopefully, through our efforts, we will continue to normalize the Cuban government's view of the Church. Along the way, we might help build a faith community, offer support to tired healthcare workers, grow some fruits and vegetables that feed hungry people. Those little things that continue to build God's Kingdom in places near and far.
