### <u>Highlights from Trinity's Sept. and Oct. Servant Leadership Board Meetings</u> FINANCE REPORT

- 1. Budget Report
- A. Receipts & Expenditures: Overall, numbers are good and trust fund balances are up about 8% from last year.
- 2. Credit Card Usage Policy: The Finance team is developed this policy for use by Trinity staff. It included a statement of understanding to be signed by all staff members who receive a church credit card.
- 3. The Endowment Committee met and all is good. No major changes were made and monies acquired are being re-invested and earning at about a 4% rate.
- 4. The Stewardship Committee are working on a two-fold project—the annual stewardship campaign and a capital campaign to raise money for the boiler in the education wing.

### TRUSTEES REPORT

- 1. The three parking lots—Trinity church, Grace House, and Trinity Park--have been patched, sealed and striped.
- 2. Brick work on the south side of the church is in progress.
- 3. Work to repair water leakages at the parsonage is to begin soon.
- 4. The alley light has been fixed!
- 5. The boiler in the original church structure was repaired, but there was another leak, which is to be re-repaired.

### PERSONNEL REPORT

1. Clergy Appreciation was Oct. 12. Jim Bowlus presented gifts to Pastor Jim and Lori.

MINISTRY UPDATES: Center for Creative Childcare (CCCC) Director, Christina Vorhes, and Assistant Director, Deidra Lambert, shared the following: ☐ There are 10 classrooms from infant through age 12, which includes an after-school
orogram. Nearly every classroom is at capacity and those that are not are due mostly to staffing shortages.
☐ There are about 100 children in the CCCC right now. Though licensed for 146, 120 is a more realistic number for capacity.
□ Costs of daycare has gotten extremely high, especially the food costs, so self-pay parents are charged a lower fee to help with managing household costs. Many of the fees, however, are obtained from Job & Family Services for those parents receiving subsidies.
□ Daycare workers are among the class of workers who provide such important and essential services yet are not paid accordingly, especially as they deal with more and more children with special needs and issues. It is a difficult job but still a very rewarding one, too!
The longevity of the CCCC's daycare staff attests to this as many of the staff have been employed at the CCCC for more than 10 years, some even more than 20 years!

### OTHER BUSINESS

- 1. Fear+Less Conversations provided by the UM Conference are taking place amongst the Lima-area United Methodist Churches. All are encouraged to attend!
- A. Developed through the Lilly Foundation, this program is to assist congregations to look beyond their walls into the communities to understand the possibilities and potentials for ministry, outreach and growth.
- B. The following U.M. congregations will be conducting these workshops as a collective: Cairo, Elida St. Paul, Forest Park, Shawnee, Trinity and Westside.

The church office is still waiting on pricing from Town & Country. If you are interested in purchasing a poinsettia please feel free to call the office in a week or two for pricing.


### **Highlights from Trinity's SLB Continued**

In other words.... I have said repeatedly that I have nine stamps in my passport – Nicaragua, Nicaragua, Nicaragua, Nicaragua X 9, Nicaragua... It is not to say I have not been anywhere else. Jami and I visited Canada a year before Canada started to stamp passports. In three trips to Cuba, I

have found that Cuba does not stamp passports. The primary reason, because of US relations with the country. It is not just that they do not stamp US passport, Cuba does not stamp any passports so that you will not have a problem in entering the US, regardless of your passport's origin. That will all change as I travel to Turkey this month; I will at least gain a Turkish stamp (and likely a French and German stamp as we connect through those airports coming and going respectively).

Identity, that is what having a passport is all about. Confirming your identity; your country of origin, the places you have been, it is all displayed within your passport.

The Kingdom of God does not hand out passports. And so, we have to find other ways to identify ourselves as a citizen of the Kingdom of God. I believe that one of the first and most prominent means of declaring that identity is in knowing how easy it is to falsify those kinds of documents. Anyone can try and wear a piece of jewelry, or a t-shirt with a clever saying on it that sounds Christian. But if you are relying upon those kinds of symbols to declare your faith, than you are probably missing the point that faith is defined as an unknowable, unprovable force. And so, it is only through our actions that we can guarantee our identity as a follower of Jesus Christ.

Faith must be acted out, over and over and over again. In ways that are consistent and constant; so that others who have faith will recognize the faith being demonstrated. It is probably about as counterintuitive as a country seen to be the enemy of most, offering hospitality to all by not recording the ongoing record of your visit in your passport. Go figure!

And look forward to announcements for Pastor Em and I to share of our journey and adventures in following in the footsteps of Paul when we get back. We will be visiting all of the Seven Cities named in the Revelation as well as a number of the places Paul visited and preached during the time of Acts.
