An update from Servant Leadership Board and Staff... Greetings. It has been a busy summer and fall and we wanted to take a few moments to share a few things that have been happening. First of all, we thank you for your continued commitment in supporting the church through your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service and your witness. The church is strongest when we all commit to growing in love of God. We appreciate the many who have helped us to do that in new ways this year.

It has certainly been a year of change and we have some other changes on the horizon. Some of you may not know this, but we have been without an evening custodian for over 4 months now. Please show appreciation to our full time custodian, Rob Stidham, who has been responsible for cleaning the entire building since that time. Like many other organizations, we have found that hiring is difficult right now which has caused us to reexamine and reorganize the way some of our processes and partnerships are working. As part of that reorganization we have been working with the day care center to adjust both the custodial and front door responsibilities. At the same time, we discovered that our front desk receptionist, Mary Trinko, will be relocating with her husband and her last day will be this week. We have been looking in to various possibilities for realigning both of these positions and will have information soon about what that will look like moving forward. If you are here during the week, there may be times when a volunteer is at the desk or when you might need to ring the bell to be let in. Please be patient with us through this transition. In the meantime, if you know anyone interested in a part time custodial position, we are currently taking applications.

Finally, you have probably noticed the outside work that has caused our parking lot to be closed the past week. This is a pretty extensive project meant to correct a few ongoing concerns at the church. The approach had extensive damage that needed repaired before winter. In addition due to growing problems with moisture and leaking in the basement of the church that had caused damage to both the ceiling and walls, it became apparent that we needed to do something to protect the building from the water. Unfortunately, the best solution involves removing the flower beds and sign from the north and east sides of the building, reinforcing the walls and replacing with concrete. Once the project is completed we will look into ways to redesign an aesthetically appealing look to those areas.

As we look forward to Thanksgiving and Christmas this year we are so grateful to be able to be in ministry together and look forward to the new and exciting ways that we can partner with God and one another to grow into a Micah 6:8 congregation committed to act justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God.
